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CITY MANAGER

Emergency Preparedness & Public Safety Information at Whale of a Day: The Emergency Preparedness Committee staffed an information booth at the City's annual Whale of a Day. Visitors had the opportunity to learn useful tips about how to be prepared in the case of an emergency and received a variety of giveaways.

City Staff also provide information about public safety and prevention tips. RPV residents also had the opportunity to learn more and see a demo of Ring's free Neighbors app. RPV residents can opt to download the app regardless if they own a Ring device and enter into an opportunity drawing to win a Video Doorbell 2. Update on HR 530 (Eshoo): On April 16, Mayor Duhovic signed a letter to Rep. Anna Eshoo (D-Palo Alto) supporting HR 530, which would overturn the Federal Communications Commission's September 2018 order limiting local regulatory authority over the deployment of wireless infrastructure to support 5G technology (see attachments). The bill has been referred to the U.S. House Energy *Subcommittee on Communications and Technology*. Last week, South Bay Rep. Ted Lieu became one of 41 cosponsors. Staff will continue to monitor this bill, as well as a court challenge of the FCC order that the City has joined as an intervenor.

Metro's Older Adult Transportation pop-up May 2: Metro and GTrans are holding an Older Adult Transportation Pop-Up event May 2 at the Ken Nakaoka Community Center in Gardena, where attendees will learn everything there is to know about using public transportation (see attachments). The 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. event will include services geared to the older adult audience.

WRD Groundwater Festival May 4: The Water Replenishment District of Southern California, which manages the region's groundwater supply, is putting on its 12th Annual Groundwater Festival May 4 at WRD headquarters in Lakewood (see attachments). The day will feature educational booths on conservation and environmental issues, plus family-friendly activities, food, games, prizes, a petting zoo and more.

Home Safety Audit PSA: RPVtv has released a PSA on free home safety audits offered to residents by the Lomita sheriff's station. FINANCE

Statewide Sales Tax Trends:

Fuel/Service Stations

Projected 3.7% increase in FY18-19 and -1.1% increase in FY19-20

Ongoing extraction in West Texas recently allowed the U.S. to become a net exporter of total oil products for the first time in 75 years. While positive news for U.S. energy independence, the latest decline in crude prices due to oversupply could cause refineries to throttle production and wait for more profitable timing. Economists also believe the diminishing demand for crude is further reflective of a slowing worldwide economy. The true test for stability and demand will be in the summer of 2019 when consumption is at its highest.

Building/Construction

Projected 5.3% increase in FY18-19 and 3.3% increase in FY19-20

Industry reports show construction levels should repeat those of the prior year. Current momentum from permitted projects will sustain higher growth for another two quarters before construction starts begin to slow. Pricing changes related to foreign tariffs are impacting bids but contractors who planned ahead will have lower-priced materials until mid-2019. In fire-impacted areas, home supply stores will see a short-term increase in procurement of essential materials, but reconstruction is months away.

PUBLIC WORKS

Maintenance Activities: This week Public Works maintenance continues to de-weed center medians throughout the City. Now that the rainy season is coming to an end, Public Works will be resuming the watering efforts for newly installed median trees on Hawthorne Blvd. and Crest Road. Public Works has also begun to water the City Hall open fields to help keep them green in anticipation for the July 4th celebration and other City events. In the parks, Public Works continues its general maintenance. Irrigation repairs were made at many sites that include PVDW, Calle Entradero, and PVIC. This weekend, Public Works, in support of Whale of A Day, set up traffic controls, cleanup and general maintenance for the annual event. Public Works also responded to a public safety concern. A manhole was reported missing on Diamondhead Lane. Public Works quickly found the utility hole cover and replaced it. The proper utility company was called out to re-inspect for proper fit. With summer just around the corner, that means more visitors to the City. In an effort to help

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keep our city looking its best, Public Works re-introduced its mobile Graffiti app, allowing residents to report graffiti for removal. The app, "My RPV", is highlighted on the RPV City main web page and is free to download and easy to use.

TSC and IMAC Public Outreach Booths: The Traffic Safety and Infrastructure Management Advisory Committees had booths at the Whale of a Day Event. It was a busy day and there was a steady flood of visitors asking questions, partaking in educational quizzes, and learning more about traffic safety, infrastructure and Public Works related activities. The public was also educated about recycling information. Public Works thanks Chairs Liu and Spain, and Members Spielman, Tye and Guerin for volunteering at the booths.



Public Outreach for Earth Month Events: Staff continues to promote the bi-annual Citywide brush-clearing event, and two document-shredding events. Ads, partially grant funded, are running in the PV News and Daily Breeze, and listserve and Nextdoor emails are adding to the outreach efforts. Staff is receiving many calls and inquiries about these popular events. Outreach will continue until the end of the month.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Las Candelitas Annual Fundraiser: On April 11th, the City issued a Special Use Permit (see attachment) for the Las Candelitas Annual Spring Fundraiser to be held on Thursday April 25, 2019 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Catalina View Gardens located at 6001 Palos Verdes Drive South. No appeals were filed. Up to 350 guests are expected to attend this 1-day event. Parking will be provided onsite and excess parking will be provided at the westerly portion of the Abalone Cove parking lot. Shuttle service will be provided to guests using the Abalone Cove parking lot.

Real Estate Signs: Over the last few years, the City has observed a proliferation of real estate signs that do not comply with the City's regulation. These noncompliant real estate signs are being placed on private property, as well as within the public right-of-way, and detract from the aesthetic character of the City. To raise awareness of the City's real estate sign regulations and to obtain voluntary compliance, on April 10, 2019, Code Enforcement Staff sent letters with an informational brochure to all real estate offices in the Peninsula. Nantasket Property Maintenance: On March 27, 2019, the City received a complaint regarding the unmaintained vacant parcels, parkway, and sidewalk along Nantasket Drive. Last week, Staff reported that the contractor for these sites trimmed the overgrown weeds in the parkway. Since then, the contractor also trimmed the overgrown vegetation on the two vacant parcels as shown in the photos below:

Revised Date for Coastal Hearings for 11 and 21 Nantasket: The Coastal Hearing for the proposed swimming pools and spas on the two properties located at 11 and 21 Nantasket Drive has been rescheduled from April 23, 2019 to April 30, 2019. A new public notice has

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been issued. The public hearing with the Coastal Hearing Officer (Director of Community Development) will occur at 2:00 p.m. in the Community Development Department Conference Room.

Cal Water Obtains Building Permits for a Diesel Fuel Tank: On April 12, 2019, a building permit (attached) was issued for a 1,000 gallon diesel fuel tank at the Cal Water site located at 5837 Crest Road. The Planning Commission approved a Conditional Use Permit at its January 9, 2018 meeting allowing, among other things, the diesel tank. A listserv message was sent to all interested parties announcing the permit issuance and pending construction. The preparation of the concrete pad for the tank was completed on April 16th, and all construction and installation of equipment is anticipated to be completed by the end of the day on April 23rd.

Arterial Fences and Walls Master Plan Update: On March 11th, Staff issued a second Request for Proposal (RFP) to local planning consulting firms after the first RFP issued to local design firms garnered no response. Unfortunately, the City did not receive responses to the second RFP either. In light of this, Staff is currently exploring other options, such as contacting other landscape architectural firms who have previously worked with the Public Works Department.

Dear Representative Eshoo:

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes wishes to express its support for H.R. 530, the *Accelerating Wireless Broadband Development by Empowering Local Communities Act of 2019*.

H.R. 530 repeals recent harmful FCC regulations limiting the ability of local governments to regulate the deployment of 5G wireless infrastructure.

Last year, the FCC adopted regulations limiting the authority of cities and states to regulate small cell sites (e.g., attachments to street light and utility poles) needed for the deployment of 5G. The FCC's regulations sharply limit the type and amount of fees cities and states may charge for profit-generating use of public property, set "shot clocks" as low as 60 days for cities and states to conduct all necessary inspections and authorize proposals, and drastically limit non-fee requirements cities and states may institute. The regulations began taking effect on January 14, 2019. Nearly 100 cities, towns, counties, utility companies, and local government associations have joined in suing the FCC over these regulations.


The FCC allowed industry to write these regulations without sufficient input from local leaders. This has led to regulations that restrict cities from requiring carriers to meet the needs of communities in which they want to operate. The FCC's order unnecessarily complicates existing agreements and negotiations between cities and wireless providers by imposing a one-size-fits-all preemption of existing state and local policies. The FCC's limits on fees for use of publicly owned property by private companies is an extreme

overreach by the federal government, forcing cities to subsidize development at the cost of other critical local services.

We all want to ensure efficient, safe, and appropriate deployment of new broadband technology. However, this sweeping regulation is not the best approach. We urge you to work together with local governments to find the best solution for effective 5G deployment that meets the diverse needs of our nation's many unique communities.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the City of Rancho Palos Verdes has approved, with conditions of approval, a Special Use Permit (Case No. PLSU2019-0001) to allow the proposed temporary use at Point View property for the Las Candalistas event on April 25, 2019.

Location: 6001 Palos Verdes Drive South

Applicant: Las Candalistas, c/o Susanne Manavian

Property Owner: Jim York

Said permit is subject to the following conditions of approval:

General Conditions:

1. Within 10 business days of this approval, the Applicant shall submit a statement in writing that they have read, understand and agree to all conditions of approval listed below. Failure to provide said written statement shall render this approval null and void.
2. The Applicant shall indemnify, protect, defend, and hold harmless, the City, and/or any of its officials, officers, employees, agents, departments, agencies, and instrumentalities thereof, from any and all claims, demands, lawsuits, writs of mandamus, and other actions and proceedings (whether legal, equitable, declaratory, administrative or adjudicatory in nature), and alternative dispute resolutions procedures (including, but not limited to arbitrations, mediations, and other such procedures) (collectively "Actions"), brought against the City, and/or any of its officials, officers, employees, agents, departments, agencies, and instrumentalities thereof, that challenge, attack, or seek to modify, set aside, void, or annul, the action of, or any permit or approval issued by, the City and/or any of its officials, officers, employees, agents, departments, agencies, and instrumentalities thereof (including actions approved by the voters of the City), for or concerning the project.
3. Approval of this permit shall not be construed as a waiver of applicable and appropriate zoning regulations, or any Federal, State, County and/or City laws and regulations. Unless otherwise expressly specified, all other requirements of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code shall apply.
4. Pursuant to Section 17.78.040, the Director of Community Development is authorized to make minor modifications to the approved plans and any of the conditions of approval if such modifications will achieve substantially the same results as would strict compliance with the approved plans and conditions. Substantial changes to the project shall be considered a

revision and require approval by the final body that approved the original project, which may require new and separate environmental review and public notification.

5. Failure to comply with and adhere to all of these conditions of approval may be cause to revoke the approval of the project pursuant to the revocation procedures contained in Section 17.86.060 of the City's Municipal Code or administrative citations as described in Section 1.16 of the City's Municipal Code.
6. In the event that any of these conditions conflict with the recommendations and/or requirements of another permitting agency or City department, the stricter standard shall apply.
7. This approval allows a special event on Thursday, April 25, 2019, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. This approval shall terminate and any privileges granted hereunder shall become null and void after 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 25, 2019.
8. The property shall remain clean and maintained in a neat and orderly manner during the special event.
9. The Applicant shall be permitted to conduct preparatory set-up and tear-down for the event on the following days:
 - Tuesday, April 23, 2019 between 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. (set-up and delivery);
 - Wednesday, April 24, 2019 between 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. (delivery of porta-potties, rental tables, chairs and tents, and display carts); and,
 - Thursday, April 25, 2019 between 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. (caterer's refrigeration truck arrives, event preparation and tear-down/clean up).
10. Equipment/construction vehicles used during the event set-up and breakdown, shall not be parked on City streets when not in use.
11. Tear down and clean-up of the site shall immediately follow the event and shall be completed by no later than 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 25, 2019.
12. No temporary or event lighting shall be permitted before (as part of the set-up), during, and after (as part of the tear-down) the event. The use of existing permanent lighting is exempt from this condition.
13. Vehicular ingress and egress to the event by all parties associated with setting up for the event, guests and participants at the event, and clean-up after the event, shall only occur at the site's driveway approach off Palos Verdes Drive South.
14. The shuttles used for the event shall only access the Point View property via the driveway

approach off Palos Verdes Drive South.

15. Participant parking shall be limited to the approved location in the north end of the parking lot at Abalone Cove Shoreline Park, as well as the 130 parking stalls located on the project site. The Applicant shall obtain City approvals to use Abalone Cove at least one week before the event.
16. Live music including amplified sound shall only be permitted between 10:30 a.m. and 1:15 p.m. All speakers shall be oriented towards the fireplace to minimize impacts to the surrounding properties.
17. The Applicant shall obtain appropriate approvals from Public Works at least one week before the event for required temporary event roadway signs. However, one off-site directional sign, not exceeding 5ft² in overall area, shall be permitted in the median. Said sign shall be removed within 24 hours after the event's conclusion.
18. At least one week prior to the event, the Applicant (Las Candalistas) shall provide an insurance certificate to the City, naming the City of Rancho Palos Verdes as additionally insured for \$1,000,000 single-limit liability and an additional insured endorsement.
19. Failure to adhere to all of these conditions shall result in the Director of Community Development's denial of any such event in the future. City Staff may be visiting the site before, during, and after the event to verify compliance with these conditions. Reports from the public may also aid in evaluating future events on the site.
20. The Director of Community Development may revoke, without incurring any liability to the permittee whatsoever, this Special Use Permit at any time, if, in the opinion of the City Manager, Director of Community Development, the City Geologist, or the Director of Public Works, determine the event is adversely affecting the public health, safety and welfare.
21. Any changes to the established schedule of event or those conditions shall be subject to further review and approval by the Director. Significant event schedule changes shall require notification to the public.
22. The City reserves the right to adjust any of the above conditions based on the conduct at any of the proposed events, as well as based on legitimate complaints received by the City from the community at large regarding the special event.
23. As determined by the City's Building Official, the Applicant shall obtain a building permit or Fire Department approval, if necessary.
24. The Applicant, by April 18, 2019, shall provide the Director of Community Development with a contact person and phone number, who will be on-site and available on the day of the

event. This person shall be available to meet with Staff during the event and shall have the ability to make immediate decisions to mitigate problems that may arise.

Any interested person may appeal this decision, in writing, to the Planning Commission by April 16, 2019. A \$2,275.00 appeal fee must accompany any appeal. The appeal shall set forth the grounds for appeal and any specific action being requested by the appellant. The Department hours are from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday, and 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Friday.
