

Organics Recycling is Easy with EDCO!

Thank you for requesting a kitchen caddy that will enhance your participation in the EDCO Organics recycling program! When EDCO begins organics recycling on **April 1, 2022**, residents can start collecting their kitchen food scraps in this kitchen caddy to conveniently empty out in your green cart to mix with green waste and other organics.

Your New Kitchen Caddy

This 1.5-gallon, sealable container can be placed under your kitchen sink or another convenient area for your household to use. The kitchen caddy locks to keep odors in and once your paper bag or caddy is full, it can be taken to your organics cart and commingled with your green waste. If necessary, the caddy can be washed out and is dishwasher safe.

These tips may help reduce odors:

- Wrap food scraps in a paper towel or old newspaper.
- Line your kitchen organics collector container with a paper bag or newspaper to absorb moisture and manage odors in your kitchen caddy.
- Sprinkle baking soda inside of the kitchen organics collector container.
- Wash your kitchen organics collector container in the dishwasher or by hand after emptying it into your green cart.

Collecting Your Food Scraps

In addition to using this kitchen caddie, you can also collect food scraps in any other container for an easy way to set aside leftovers for your green organics cart. Coffee cans, plastic food storage containers, or other kitchen containers can be used.



STEP 1

Keep your kitchen container in a convenient location in your kitchen, such as on the counter top, under the sink or in the freezer.



STEP 2

While cooking or cleaning up, place leftover food scraps and food-soiled paper into your kitchen container or paper bag.



STEP 3

Empty the contents of your kitchen container into your green cart when it's full and before you set out the cart each week.
