November 2: “The Artistic Inspiration of Palos Verdes” at Peninsula Seniors, Scriba Family Center

Portuguese Bend local artist **Steve Shriver** has lived in Palos Verdes most of his life. He has been making art since 1980 and has worked for many years as a decorative painter with commissions around the world, across the U.S., and on the Peninsula, where he restored the ornate ceilings at the Neighborhood Church. Steve will cover highlights of Palos Verdes art in our structures and surroundings coupled with his own artistic contributions.

November 9: “What’s New for Fall and Winter at the Botanic Garden” at Peninsula Seniors, Scriba Family Center

Stephanie Yinger, Manager of Community Relations, and **Grace Cuffel**, Coordinator of Volunteer Programs at South Coast Botanic Garden give a look at current exhibits, lectures, classes, and events, and what’s in store for the holidays at this 87-acre oasis in Palos Verdes. It is one of the world’s first botanic gardens to be developed over a sanitary landfill to become a great treasure of the community and Los Angeles.

November 16: “Why We Need New Vaccines, Now” at Hesse Park

Join us for a timely presentation by **Dr. David Meyer**, President, and CEO of the Lundquist Institute that champions bio-medical research and innovations, making an impact around the world for 70 years. Dr. Meyer will discuss the future of new vaccines and why they are needed now. Dr. Meyer is professor emeritus at the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA and has served as the Lundquist Institute’s president and CEO since 2009.

November 30: “Governor William Penn: A Forgotten American Hero” at Hesse Park

Jim MacLellan, former director of trade development for the Port of Los Angeles, will present a history talk on Governor William Penn, a Quaker and founder of Pennsylvania (Sylvania Latin for woods), and whose democratic principles served as an inspiration for the U.S. Constitution. His statue sits atop city hall in Philadelphia.
