Palos Verdes Peninsula Emergency Readiness

The Palos Verdes Peninsula Cities, with public safety partners, have launched a new evacuation tool for the community. Know Your Zone maps will be utilized to prepare you in the event of an emergency.

Knowing your zone is critical to the evacuation process and can help determine your next steps if there is a wildfire or emergency situation.

EMERGENT: 9-1-1 CALL

- Medical issue that may result in significant injury or death
- Traffic collision resulting in injuries
- Crime *JUST* occurred
- Crime *IS* occurring **NOW**
- Crime is *ABOUT* to occur

NON-EMERGENT: 310-539-1661

- Crime occurred in the past & there is no reason to believe the person(s) responsible are still nearby
- Traffic collisions with no injuries
- Suspicious activity
- Any other matters requiring attention of station personnel



DESCRIBING CRIME

- Location
- Description of person(s) involved
 - Color of clothing
 - Gender
 - Ethnicity
 - Distinguishing features (TATTOOS, SCARS, ETC)
 - Approximate age
- Does the person(s) have any weapons

IF PEOPLE ARE FLEEING THE SCENE

- Vehicle description
 - Make
 - Model
 - Color
 - License plate (IF POSSIBLE)
- What direction is the vehicle traveling



How to File a Police Report Online

To file a police report online with the Sheriff's Department, go to:

LASD.ORG/SORTS



If you are a victim of any of these incidents, you can file a report using SORTS:

- Lost or stolen cell phones valued \$950 or less
- Lost or stolen property valued \$950 or less
- Vandalism, excluding graffiti, where damage is valued under \$400
- Theft from an unlocked vehicle valued \$950 or less
- Theft from an open or unsecured area valued \$950 or less
- Supplemental Loss Form (Must already have a LASD report number)



Winterization Plan



1 - Altamira Canyon

- Canyon grading & liner at base
- Filling fissures and grabens in nearby areas

2 - Portuguese, Ishibashi, Paintbrush Canyons

3 - Klondike Canyon

4 - Seaview Community

- Street re-grading & re-surfacing: Exultant & Admirable Drive
- Exultant & Dauntless protective measures



Storm Prep and Response

- Closely monitored winterized areas.
- Pre-filled sandbags and prepared them for deployment.
- Restocked sand and loose sandbags for resident pickup.
- Cleared culverts and catch basins Citywide.
- Prepared two high-capacity water pumps on standby for flood control.
- Provided tarps and sandbags to landslide area residents.
- Quickly cleared minor debris and ponding.

Swale Maintenance Reminder



It's time to clean drainage swales that become full of leaves, overgrown vegetation, and debris.

It is a property owner's responsibility to maintain a drainage swale so that it functions properly.

Improperly maintained drainage swales can result in property damage.



The Municipal Code does not permit the construction of any structure within or above a drainage swale, or on a slope on or equal to 35% or greater. This includes decks, stairs, or structures of any kind.

Voluntary Property Buyout Program Update

85 eligible applications received

- 52 (61%) in PBCA
- 21 (25%) in Seaview
- 12 (14%) in Beach Club

70 of the 85 were inspected

- 20 red-tagged
- 37 yellow-tagged
- 14 green-tagged

14 of the 85 not inspected

Review and selection process expected to take at least several months.

Current tags Citywide

- 20 red-tagged
- 39 yellow-tagged
- 20 green-tagged


