February 17th Weekly Report Excerpt

County-wide Parks Needs Assessment Community Engagement Workshop

The County of Los Angeles, as part of its ongoing Countywide Needs Assessment requested that all Cities in the County conduct a community workshop. 95% of cities participated, including Rancho Palos Verdes on January 27th at Hesse Park. Approximately 25 people attended this lively workshop which included a power point presentation detailing the County's Needs Assessment process and the City's Parks Master Plan effort. As part of each County workshop, attendees identified projects within the scope of their city or study area. These results have been forwarded to the County to provide a general sense of the type, number, and scope of possible projects contained in the County's 189 study areas. Participation in this County-run process does not obligate the City to build any of the projects listed below. This information, along with information from the entire County-wide needs assessment, will help the County decide if they are going to seek voter approval for a future Parks & Recreation bond measure to replace Proposition A which has been funding park projects since the mid-1990s.

RPV's workshop followed guidelines established by the County. At the end of the workshop, attendees placed dots on potential projects to indicate their level of support. All of the items on the list below are included in the Parks Master Plan with the exception of fencing improvements and bike paths at park sites. Fencing, while not specifically mentioned in the Master Plan, is included in the general category of improving park amenities as well as the Recreation priority to "Identify and apply methods to better protect and maintain existing parks and open space resources." (Master Plan, p. 33). Bike paths for youth were extensively discussed during the Master Plan process but were not included in the adopted version.

After reviewing the workshop results with County personnel to make sure they match the Need's Assessment's criteria, Staff sent ten projects to the County (in bold below). The Hesse Park Fencing Project was merged with the overall fencing project. Providing this list to the County does not create an obligation to proceed with any of these projects.
